READ JOB 38–40

CHAPTER 38

THEN the LORD answered Job out of the whirlwind, and said,

- 2 Who *is* this that darkeneth counsel by words without knowledge?
- 3 Gird up now thy loins like a man; for I will demand of thee, and answer thou me.
- 4. Where wast thou when I laid the foundations of the earth? declare, if thou hast understanding.
- 5 Who hath laid the measures thereof, if thou knowest? or who hath stretched the line upon it?
- 6 Whereupon are the foundations thereof fastened? or who laid the corner stone thereof;
- 7 When the morning stars sang together, and all the sons of God shouted for joy?
- 8 Or *who* shut up the sea with doors, when it brake forth, *as if* it had issued out of the womb?
- 9 When I made the cloud the garment thereof, and thick darkness a swaddlingband for it,
- 10 And brake up for it my decreed *place*, and set bars and

doors,

- 11 And said, Hitherto shalt thou come, but no further: and here shall thy proud waves be stayed?
- 12. Hast thou commanded the morning since thy days; *and* caused the dayspring to know his place;
- 13 That it might take hold of the ends of the earth, that the wicked might be shaken out of it?
- 14 It is turned as clay *to* the seal; and they stand as a garment.
- 15 And from the wicked their light is withholden, and the high arm shall be broken.
- 16 Hast thou entered into the springs of the sea? or hast thou walked in the search of the depth?
- 17 Have the gates of death been opened unto thee? or hast thou seen the doors of the shadow of death?
- 18 Hast thou perceived the breadth of the earth? declare if thou knowest it all.
- 19 Where *is* the way *where* light dwelleth? and *as for* darkness, where *is* the place thereof,
 - 20 That thou shouldest take it

to the bound thereof, and that thou shouldest know the paths *to* the house thereof?

- 21 Knowest thou *it*, because thou wast then born? or *because* the number of thy days *is* great?
- 22 Hast thou entered into the treasures of the snow? or hast thou seen the treasures of the hail,
- 23 Which I have reserved against the time of trouble, against the day of battle and war?
- 24 By what way is the light parted, *which* scattereth the east wind upon the earth?
- 25. Who hath divided a watercourse for the overflowing of waters, or a way for the lightning of thunder;
- 26 To cause it to rain on the earth, *where* no man *is; on* the wilderness, wherein *there is* no man;
- 27 To satisfy the desolate and waste *ground*; and to cause the bud of the tender herb to spring forth?
- 28 Hath the rain a father? or who hath begotten the drops of dew?
- 29 Out of whose womb came the ice? and the hoary frost of heaven, who hath gendered it?
- 30 The waters are hid as *with* a stone, and the face of the deep is

frozen.

- 31 Canst thou bind the sweet influences of Pleiades, or loose the bands of Orion?
- 32 Canst thou bring forth Mazzaroth in his season? or canst thou guide Arcturus with his sons?
- 33 Knowest thou the ordinances of heaven? canst thou set the dominion thereof in the earth?
- 34 Canst thou lift up thy voice to the clouds, that abundance of waters may cover thee?
- 35 Canst thou send lightnings, that they may go, and say unto thee, Here we *are*?
- 36 Who hath put wisdom in the inward parts? or who hath given understanding to the heart?
- 37 Who can number the clouds in wisdom? or who can stay the bottles of heaven,
- 38 When the dust groweth into hardness, and the clods cleave fast together?
- 39 Wilt thou hunt the prey for the lion? or fill the appetite of the young lions,
- 40 When they couch in *their* dens, *and* abide in the covert to lie in wait?
- 41 Who provideth for the raven his food? when his young ones cry unto God, they wander for lack of

meat.

CHAPTER 39

NOWEST thou the time when the wild goats of the rock bring forth? *or* canst thou mark when the hinds do calve?

- 2 Canst thou number the months *that* they fulfil? or knowest thou the time when they bring forth?
- 3 They bow themselves, they bring forth their young ones, they cast out their sorrows.
- 4 Their young ones are in good liking, they grow up with corn; they go forth, and return not unto them.
- 5 Who hath sent out the wild ass free? or who hath loosed the bands of the wild ass?
- 6 Whose house I have made the wilderness, and the barren land his dwellings.
- 7 He scorneth the multitude of the city, neither regardeth he the crying of the driver.
- 8 The range of the mountains *is* his pasture, and he searcheth after every green thing.
- 9 Will the unicorn be willing to serve thee, or abide by thy crib?
- 10 Canst thou bind the unicorn with his band in the furrow? or will he harrow the valleys after thee?
 - 11 Wilt thou trust him, because

- his strength *is* great? or wilt thou leave thy labour to him?
- 12 Wilt thou believe him, that he will bring home thy seed, and gather *it into* thy barn?
- 13. *Gavest thou* the goodly wings unto the peacocks? or wings and feathers unto the ostrich?
- 14 Which leaveth her eggs in the earth, and warmeth them in dust,
- 15 And forgetteth that the foot may crush them, or that the wild beast may break them.
- 16 She is hardened against her young ones, as though *they were* not hers: her labour is in vain without fear;
- 17 Because God hath deprived her of wisdom, neither hath he imparted to her understanding.
- 18 What time she lifteth up herself on high, she scorneth the horse and his rider.
- 19. Hast thou given the horse strength? hast thou clothed his neck with thunder?
- 20 Canst thou make him afraid as a grasshopper? the glory of his nostrils *is* terrible.
- 21 He paweth in the valley, and rejoiceth in *his* strength: he goeth on to meet the armed men.
- 22 He mocketh at fear, and is not affrighted; neither turneth he

back from the sword.

- 23 The quiver rattleth against him, the glittering spear and the shield.
- 24 He swalloweth the ground with fierceness and rage: neither believeth he that *it is* the sound of the trumpet.
- 25 He saith among the trumpets, Ha, ha; and he smelleth the battle afar off, the thunder of the captains, and the shouting.
- 26. Doth the hawk fly by thy wisdom, *and* stretch her wings toward the south?
- 27 Doth the eagle mount up at thy command, and make her nest on high?
- 28 She dwelleth and abideth on the rock, upon the crag of the rock, and the strong place.
- 29 From thence she seeketh the prey, *and* her eyes behold afar off.
- 30 Her young ones also suck up blood: and where the slain *are*, there *is* she.

CHAPTER 40

OREOVER the LORD answered Job, and said,

- 2 Shall he that contendeth with the Almighty instruct *him*? he that reproveth God, let him answer it.
- 3 ¶ Then Job answered the LORD, and said,

- 4 Behold, I am vile; what shall I answer thee? I will lay mine hand upon my mouth.
- 5 Once have I spoken; but I will not answer: yea, twice; but I will proceed no further.
- 6 ¶ Then answered the LORD unto Job out of the whirlwind, and said,
- 7 Gird up thy loins now like a man: I will demand of thee, and declare thou unto me.
- 8 Wilt thou also disannul my judgment? wilt thou condemn me, that thou mayest be righteous?
- 9 Hast thou an arm like God? or canst thou thunder with a voice like him?
- 10 Deck thyself now *with* majesty and excellency; and array thyself with glory and beauty.
- 11 Cast abroad the rage of thy wrath: and behold every one *that is* proud, and abase him.
- 12 Look on every one *that is* proud, *and* bring him low; and tread down the wicked in their place.
- 13 Hide them in the dust together; and bind their faces in secret.
- 14 Then will I also confess unto thee that thine own right hand can save thee.
 - 15 ¶ Behold now behemoth,

which I made with thee; he eateth grass as an ox.

- 16 Lo now, his strength *is* in his loins, and his force *is* in the navel of his belly.
- 17 He moveth his tail like a cedar: the sinews of his stones are wrapped together.
- 18 His bones *are as* strong pieces of brass; his bones *are* like bars of iron.
- 19 He *is* the chief of the ways of God: he that made him can make his sword to approach *unto him*.
 - 20 Surely the mountains bring

- him forth food, where all the beasts of the field play.
- 21 He lieth under the shady trees, in the covert of the reed, and fens.
- 22 The shady trees cover him *with* their shadow; the willows of the brook compass him about.
- 23 Behold, he drinketh up a river, *and* hasteth not: he trusteth that he can draw up Jordan into his mouth.
- 24 He taketh it with his eyes: *his* nose pierceth through snares.

DEVOTIONAL COMMENTS

Following the discourses of Job, his three friends and Elihu, the next voice is that of the Master. The Lord Jehovah appears unexpectedly in a whirlwind. He is heard by Job, his three friends, and Elihu. Job is about to discover how limited human wisdom is, apart from revelation!

God asks Job several simple questions about the universe and its operation. He begins with creation; then turns to inanimate nature, the snow, hail, rain, and ice. He next asks about animal life. After all the heart-searching questions God put to Job, He then demanded a reply. And Job said, "Behold, I am vile; what shall I answer thee? I will ay mine hand upon my mouth. Once have I spoken; but I will not answer; yea, twice; but I will proceed no further." It is obvious from these words that Job fell before the Lord in humble repentance. When his friends had spoken to him and tried to reprove him, he became incensed with their arguments. However, realizing the truth of all God had said, Job was brought face to face with himself before his Lord. He was silenced as he realized his own sinfulness.

Job had no answer for his complaining. Indeed, he had to realize that his circumstances were ordered by the Lord. It is true that when one knows the Lord and follows Him, whatever befalls him may be received and respected as God's will. God makes no

mistakes. He is Almighty, He is Sovereign. In Isaiah 45 He declares six times, "I am the LORD, and there is none else." What a lesson for us today! That we might fully realize that He is the Lord. Were we to do so, we would not worry. And how ridiculous that, as believers, we do fret and worry. Our God created the heavens and the earth, and all that is within the scope of the universe. Beyond that, He offers to provide our every need. How foolish that, as Christians, we fail to trust in His grace and providence!



ROBERT GREENE LEE 1886-1978

Robert G. Lee began his career on a farm near Fort Mill, South Carolina, where he was born of poor but deeply religious parents. Early in life, he felt the call to be a preacher, and in spite of many obstacles he heeded that call. He won many scholastic and oratory honors at the Furman Preparatory School and Furman University, Greenville, South Carolina, where he graduated with an A.B. degree in 1913. He took postgraduate work at the Chicago Law School, receiving a Ph.D. in international law in 1919. He was ordained at his boyhood church at



Fort Mill, South Carolina, in 1910.

His first full-time pastorate was at Edgefield, South Carolina. This was followed by pastorates at First Baptist Church, Chester, South Carolina; First Baptist Church, New Orleans, Louisiana; and Citadel Square Baptist Church, Charleston, South Carolina. He was pastor of the Bellevue Baptist Church, Memphis, Tennessee, from December, 1927, to April 10, 1960. During his pastorate at Bellevue, over 24,000 people joined the church, over 7,600 of these for baptism. Dr. Lee preached his famous sermon, *Payday...Some Day*, over 1,200 times in the United States and other countries. He died July 20, 1978, in his home in Memphis, Tennessee.
