MARCH 8 Read Joshua 12–14

CHAPTER 12

Now these *are* the kings of the land, which the children of Israel smote, and possessed their land on the other side Jordan toward the rising of the sun, from the river Arnon unto mount Hermon, and all the plain on the east:

- 2 Sihon king of the Amorites, who dwelt in Heshbon, *and* ruled from Aroer, which *is* upon the bank of the river Arnon, and from the middle of the river, and from half Gilead, even unto the river Jabbok, *which is* the border of the children of Ammon;
- 3 And from the plain to the sea of Chinneroth on the east, and unto the sea of the plain, *even* the salt sea on the east, the way to Bethjeshimoth; and from the south, under Ashdothpisgah:
- 4 ¶ And the coast of Og king of Bashan, *which was* of the remnant of the giants, that dwelt at Ashtaroth and at Edrei,
- 5 And reigned in mount Hermon, and in Salcah, and in all Bashan, unto the border of the

Geshurites and the Maachathites, and half Gilead, the border of Sihon king of Heshbon.

- 6 Them did Moses the servant of the LORD and the children of Israel smite: and Moses the servant of the LORD gave it *for* a possession unto the Reubenites, and the Gadites, and the half tribe of Manasseh.
- 7 ¶ And these *are* the kings of the country which Joshua and the children of Israel smote on this side Jordan on the west, from Baalgad in the valley of Lebanon even unto the mount Halak, that goeth up to Seir; which Joshua gave unto the tribes of Israel *for* a possession according to their divisions;
- 8 In the mountains, and in the valleys, and in the plains, and in the springs, and in the wilderness, and in the south country; the Hittites, the Amorites, and the Canaanites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites:
- 9 ¶ The king of Jericho, one; the king of Ai, which *is* beside Bethel, one;
 - 10 The king of Jerusalem, one;

the king of Hebron, one;

- 11 The king of Jarmuth, one; the king of Lachish, one;
- 12 The king of Eglon, one; the king of Gezer, one;
- 13 The king of Debir, one; the king of Geder, one;
- 14 The king of Hormah, one; the king of Arad, one;
- 15 The king of Libnah, one; the king of Adullam, one;
- 16 The king of Makkedah, one; the king of Bethel, one;
- 17 The king of Tappuah, one; the king of Hepher, one;
- 18 The king of Aphek, one; the king of Lasharon, one;
- 19 The king of Madon, one; the king of Hazor, one;
- 20 The king of Shimronmeron, one; the king of Achshaph, one;
- 21 The king of Taanach, one; the king of Megiddo, one;
- 22 The king of Kedesh, one; the king of Jokneam of Carmel, one;
- 23 The king of Dor in the coast of Dor, one; the king of the nations of Gilgal, one;
- 24 The king of Tirzah, one: all the kings thirty and one.

CHAPTER 13

NOW Joshua was old and stricken in years; and the LORD said unto him, Thou art old and strick-

- en in years, and there remaineth yet very much land to be possessed.
- 2 This *is* the land that yet remaineth: all the borders of the Philistines, and all Geshuri,
- 3 From Sihor, which *is* before Egypt, even unto the borders of Ekron northward, *which* is counted to the Canaanite: five lords of the Philistines; the Gazathites, and the Ashdothites, the Eshkalonites, the Gittites, and the Ekronites; also the Avites:
- 4 From the south, all the land of the Canaanites, and Mearah that *is* beside the Sidonians, unto Aphek, to the borders of the Amorites:
- 5 And the land of the Giblites, and all Lebanon, toward the sunrising, from Baalgad under mount Hermon unto the entering into Hamath.
- 6 All the inhabitants of the hill country from Lebanon unto Misrephothmaim, and all the Sidonians, them will I drive out from before the children of Israel: only divide thou it by lot unto the Israelites for an inheritance, as I have commanded thee.
- 7. Now therefore divide this land for an inheritance unto the nine tribes, and the half tribe of Manasseh,

- 8 With whom the Reubenites and the Gadites have received their inheritance, which Moses gave them, beyond Jordan eastward, *even* as Moses the servant of the LORD gave them;
- 9 From Aroer, that *is* upon the bank of the river Arnon, and the city that *is* in the midst of the river, and all the plain of Medeba unto Dibon;
- 10 And all the cities of Sihon king of the Amorites, which reigned in Heshbon, unto the border of the children of Ammon;
- 11 And Gilead, and the border of the Geshurites and Maachathites, and all mount Hermon, and all Bashan unto Salcah;
- 12 All the kingdom of Og in Bashan, which reigned in Ashtaroth and in Edrei, who remained of the remnant of the giants: for these did Moses smite, and cast them out.
- 13 Nevertheless the children of Israel expelled not the Geshurites, nor the Maachathites: but the Geshurites and the Maachathites dwell among the Israelites until this day.
- 14 Only unto the tribe of Levi he gave none inheritance; the sacrifices of the LORD God of Israel

- made by fire *are* their inheritance, as he said unto them.
- 15 ¶ And Moses gave unto the tribe of the children of Reuben *inheritance* according to their families.
- 16 And their coast was from Aroer, that *is* on the bank of the river Arnon, and the city that *is* in the midst of the river, and all the plain by Medeba;
- 17 Heshbon, and all her cities that *are* in the plain; Dibon, and Bamothbaal, and Bethbaalmeon,
- 18 And Jahazah, and Kedemoth, and Mephaath,
- 19 And Kirjathaim, and Sibmah, and Zarethshahar in the mount of the valley,
- 20 And Bethpeor, and Ashdothpisgah, and Bethjeshimoth,
- 21 And all the cities of the plain, and all the kingdom of Sihon king of the Amorites, which reigned in Heshbon, whom Moses smote with the princes of Midian, Evi, and Rekem, and Zur, and Hur, and Reba, which were dukes of Sihon, dwelling in the country.
- 22 ¶ Balaam also the son of Beor, the soothsayer, did the children of Israel slay with the sword among them that were slain by them.
 - 23 And the border of the chil-

dren of Reuben was Jordan, and the border *thereof*. This *was* the inheritance of the children of Reuben after their families, the cities and the villages thereof.

- 24 And Moses gave *inheritance* unto the tribe of Gad, *even* unto the children of Gad according to their families.
- 25 And their coast was Jazer, and all the cities of Gilead, and half the land of the children of Ammon, unto Aroer that *is* before Rabbah;
- 26 And from Heshbon unto Ramathmizpeh, and Betonim; and from Mahanaim unto the border of Debir;
- 27 And in the valley, Betharam, and Bethnimrah, and Succoth, and Zaphon, the rest of the kingdom of Sihon king of Heshbon, Jordan and his border, even unto the edge of the sea of Chinnereth on the other side Jordan eastward.
- 28 This *is* the inheritance of the children of Gad after their families, the cities, and their villages.
- 29 ¶ And Moses gave *inheritance* unto the half tribe of Manasseh: and *this* was *the possession* of the half tribe of the children of Manasseh by their families.
- 30 And their coast was from Mahanaim, all Bashan, all the

kingdom of Og king of Bashan, and all the towns of Jair, which *are* in Bashan, threescore cities:

- Ashtaroth, and Edrei, cities of the kingdom of Og in Bashan, were pertaining unto the children of Machir the son of Manasseh, even to the one half of the children of Machir by their families.
- 32 These *are the countries* which Moses did distribute for inheritance in the plains of Moab, on the other side Jordan, by Jericho, eastward.
- 33 But unto the tribe of Levi Moses gave not *any* inheritance: the LORD God of Israel *was* their inheritance, as he said unto them.

CHAPTER 14

AND these are the countries which the children of Israel inherited in the land of Canaan, which Eleazar the priest, and Joshua the son of Nun, and the heads of the fathers of the tribes of the children of Israel, distributed for inheritance to them.

- 2 By lot *was* their inheritance, as the LORD commanded by the hand of Moses, for the nine tribes, and *for* the half tribe.
- 3 For Moses had given the inheritance of two tribes and an half tribe on the other side Jordan:

but unto the Levites he gave none inheritance among them.

- 4 For the children of Joseph were two tribes, Manasseh and Ephraim: therefore they gave no part unto the Levites in the land, save cities to dwell *in*, with their suburbs for their cattle and for their substance.
- 5 As the LORD commanded Moses, so the children of Israel did, and they divided the land.
- 6 ¶ Then the children of Judah came unto Joshua in Gilgal: and Caleb the son of Jephunneh the Kenezite said unto him, Thou knowest the thing that the LORD said unto Moses the man of God concerning me and thee in Kadeshbarnea.
- 7 Forty years old *was* I when Moses the servant of the LORD sent me from Kadeshbarnea to espy out the land; and I brought him word again as *it was* in mine heart.
- 8 Nevertheless my brethren that went up with me made the heart of the people melt: but I wholly followed the LORD my God.
- 9 And Moses sware on that day, saying, Surely the land whereon thy feet have trodden shall be thine inheritance, and thy children's for ever, because thou hast wholly followed the LORD my God.

- 10 And now, behold, the LORD hath kept me alive, as he said, these forty and five years, even since the LORD spake this word unto Moses, while *the children of* Israel wandered in the wilderness: and now, lo, I *am* this day fourscore and five years old.
- 11 As yet I *am as* strong this day as *I was* in the day that Moses sent me: as my strength *was* then, even so *is* my strength now, for war, both to go out, and to come in.
- 12 Now therefore give me this mountain, whereof the LORD spake in that day; for thou heardest in that day how the Anakims were there, and that the cities were great and fenced: if so be the LORD will be with me, then I shall be able to drive them out, as the LORD said.
- 13 And Joshua blessed him, and gave unto Caleb the son of Jephunneh Hebron for an inheritance.
- 14 Hebron therefore became the inheritance of Caleb the son of Jephunneh the Kenezite unto this day, because that he wholly followed the LORD God of Israel.
- 15 And the name of Hebron before *was* Kirjatharba; *which Arba was* a great man among the Anakims. And the land had rest from war.

DEVOTIONAL COMMENTS

In chapter 12 the conquests of Transjordan are reviewed (verses 1-6), as well as the conquests in Canaan, with the roster of the kings who were conquered listed in verses 7-24.

In chapter 13 Joshua is instructed by the Lord to apportion the land they now possess, and is also told by the Lord that "there remaineth yet very much land to be possessed." The unpossessed land is outlined in verses 2-7.

In chapter 14 Joshua is giving each tribe its special inheritance, and Caleb comes to claim his share. He reminds Joshua of God's promise, for it is only on the basis of God's Word that we can claim our blessings. Note the glorious testimony of strength Caleb gives in verses 10 and 11. It has been 45 years since the nation's failure at Kadesh-Barnea, and Caleb is now 85 years old; yet he is anxious to claim his inheritance to the glory of God. God had promised him the inheritance, and Caleb had the faith to believe that what God promised He was able to perform.

Caleb was able to drive out the inhabitants of his inheritance, the very "giants" that the ten unbelieving spies had feared. Unbelief looks at the giants; faith looks to God. Unbelief depends on man's "common sense"; faith rests wholly on the Word of God. Caleb's dedication and faith saved his life, gained him an inheritance, overcame the enemy, and enabled him to enrich his own family for years to come.

HYMN FOR TODAY

SAVIOUR, LIKE A SHEPHERD LEAD US by Dorothy A. Thrupp, 1799-1847

Divine guidance is the very essence of Christianity. The Bible equates being guided by the Spirit of God with being a child of God (Romans 8:14). But even as our natural children can sometimes rebel against

parental authority, so we too can forsake God's leading in our lives and seek to go our own ways. God's leading, then, doesn't just happen. There must be the sincere desire and willingness to be guided. With implicit faith we must recognize that God has a planned path for each of His children, and we must deeply desire to follow that path wherever it leads. Scriptural promises such as Jeremiah 29:11 become our source of daily encouragement.

The author of this popular hymn, Dorothy Thrupp, was born and lived in London, England. She was a rather prolific writer of children's hymns and devotional materials although she seldom signed her name to any of her works. When she did, she would use a pseudonym. For this reason it has never been fully proven that she was the actual author of "Saviour, Like a Shepherd Lead Us." The hymn first appeared unsigned in her collection *Hymns for the Young*, in 1836.

Saviour, like a shepherd lead us; much we need Thy tender care;

in Thy pleasant pastures feed us; for our use Thy folds prepare:

Blessed Jesus, blessed Jesus, Thou hast bought us, Thine we are; blessed Jesus, blessed Jesus, Thou hast bought us, Thine we are.

We are Thine—do Thou befriend us; be the Guardian of our way;

keep Thy flock, from sin defend us; seek us when we go astray:

Blessed Jesus, blessed Jesus, hear, O hear us when we pray; blessed Jesus, blessed Jesus, hear, O hear us when we pray.

Thou hast promised to receive us, poor and sinful tho we be;

Thou hast mercy to relieve us, grace to cleanse and pow'r to free:

Blessed Jesus, blessed Jesus, early let us turn to Thee; blessed Jesus, blessed Jesus, early let us turn to Thee.

Early let us seek Thy favor; early let us do Thy will; blessed Lord and only Saviour, with Thy love our bosoms fill:

Blessed Jesus, blessed Jesus, Thou hast loved us; love us still; blessed Jesus, blessed Jesus, Thou hast loved us; love us still.
