READ EZEKIEL 38–40

CHAPTER 38

AND the word of the LORD came unto me, saying,

- 2 Son of man, set thy face against Gog, the land of Magog, the chief prince of Meshech and Tubal, and prophesy against him,
- 3 And say, Thus saith the Lord God; Behold, I *am* against thee, O Gog, the chief prince of Meshech and Tubal:
- 4 And I will turn thee back, and put hooks into thy jaws, and I will bring thee forth, and all thine army, horses and horsemen, all of them clothed with all sorts of armour, even a great company with bucklers and shields, all of them handling swords:
- 5 Persia, Ethiopia, and Libya with them; all of them with shield and helmet:
- 6 Gomer, and all his bands; the house of Togarmah of the north quarters, and all his bands: *and* many people with thee.
- 7 Be thou prepared, and prepare for thyself, thou, and all thy company that are assembled unto thee,

and be thou a guard unto them.

- 8 ¶ After many days thou shalt be visited: in the latter years thou shalt come into the land *that is* brought back from the sword, *and is* gathered out of many people, against the mountains of Israel, which have been always waste: but it is brought forth out of the nations, and they shall dwell safely all of them.
- 9 Thou shalt ascend and come like a storm, thou shalt be like a cloud to cover the land, thou, and all thy bands, and many people with thee.
- 10 Thus saith the Lord God; It shall also come to pass, *that* at the same time shall things come into thy mind, and thou shalt think an evil thought:
- 11 And thou shalt say, I will go up to the land of unwalled villages; I will go to them that are at rest, that dwell safely, all of them dwelling without walls, and having neither bars nor gates,
- 12 To take a spoil, and to take a prey; to turn thine hand upon the

desolate places *that are now* inhabited, and upon the people *that are* gathered out of the nations, which have gotten cattle and goods, that dwell in the midst of the land.

- 13 Sheba, and Dedan, and the merchants of Tarshish, with all the young lions thereof, shall say unto thee, Art thou come to take a spoil? hast thou gathered thy company to take a prey? to carry away silver and gold, to take away cattle and goods, to take a great spoil?
- 14 ¶ Therefore, son of man, prophesy and say unto Gog, Thus saith the Lord God; In that day when my people of Israel dwelleth safely, shalt thou not know *it*?
- 15 And thou shalt come from thy place out of the north parts, thou, and many people with thee, all of them riding upon horses, a great company, and a mighty army:
- 16 And thou shalt come up against my people of Israel, as a cloud to cover the land; it shall be in the latter days, and I will bring thee against my land, that the heathen may know me, when I shall be sanctified in thee, O Gog, before their eyes.
- 17 Thus saith the Lord God; *Art* thou he of whom I have spoken in old time by my servants the

- prophets of Israel, which prophesied in those days *many* years that I would bring thee against them?
- 18 And it shall come to pass at the same time when Gog shall come against the land of Israel, saith the Lord God, *that* my fury shall come up in my face.
- 19 For in my jealousy *and* in the fire of my wrath have I spoken, Surely in that day there shall be a great shaking in the land of Israel;
- 20 So that the fishes of the sea, and the fowls of the heaven, and the beasts of the field, and all creeping things that creep upon the earth, and all the men that *are* upon the face of the earth, shall shake at my presence, and the mountains shall be thrown down, and the steep places shall fall, and every wall shall fall to the ground.
- 21 And I will call for a sword against him throughout all my mountains, saith the Lord God: every man's sword shall be against his brother.
- 22 And I will plead against him with pestilence and with blood; and I will rain upon him, and upon his bands, and upon the many people that *are* with him, an overflowing rain, and great hailstones, fire, and brimstone.

23 Thus will I magnify myself, and sanctify myself; and I will be known in the eyes of many nations, and they shall know that I *am* the LORD.

CHAPTER 39

THEREFORE, thou son of man, prophesy against Gog, and say, Thus saith the Lord God; Behold, I am against thee, O Gog, the chief prince of Meshech and Tubal:

- 2 And I will turn thee back, and leave but the sixth part of thee, and will cause thee to come up from the north parts, and will bring thee upon the mountains of Israel:
- 3 And I will smite thy bow out of thy left hand, and will cause thine arrows to fall out of thy right hand.
- 4 Thou shalt fall upon the mountains of Israel, thou, and all thy bands, and the people that *is* with thee: I will give thee unto the ravenous birds of every sort, and *to* the beasts of the field to be devoured.
- 5 Thou shalt fall upon the open field: for I have spoken *it*, saith the Lord God.
- 6 And I will send a fire on Magog, and among them that dwell carelessly in the isles: and they shall know that I *am* the LORD.
 - 7 So will I make my holy name

known in the midst of my people Israel; and I will not *let them* pollute my holy name any more: and the heathen shall know that I *am* the LORD, the Holy One in Israel.

- 8 ¶ Behold, it is come, and it is done, saith the Lord GoD; this *is* the day whereof I have spoken.
- 9 And they that dwell in the cities of Israel shall go forth, and shall set on fire and burn the weapons, both the shields and the bucklers, the bows and the arrows, and the handstaves, and the spears, and they shall burn them with fire seven years:
- 10 So that they shall take no wood out of the field, neither cut down *any* out of the forests; for they shall burn the weapons with fire: and they shall spoil those that spoiled them, and rob those that robbed them, saith the Lord God.
- 11 ¶ And it shall come to pass in that day, *that* I will give unto Gog a place there of graves in Israel, the valley of the passengers on the east of the sea: and it shall stop the *noses* of the passengers: and there shall they bury Gog and all his multitude: and they shall call *it* The valley of Hamongog.
- 12 And seven months shall the house of Israel be burying of them,

that they may cleanse the land.

- 13 Yea, all the people of the land shall bury *them*; and it shall be to them a renown the day that I shall be glorified, saith the Lord God.
- 14 And they shall sever out men of continual employment, passing through the land to bury with the passengers those that remain upon the face of the earth, to cleanse it: after the end of seven months shall they search.
- 15 And the passengers *that* pass through the land, when *any* seeth a man's bone, then shall he set up a sign by it, till the buriers have buried it in the valley of Hamongog.
- 16 And also the name of the city shall be Hamonah. Thus shall they cleanse the land.
- 17 ¶ And, thou son of man, thus saith the Lord God; Speak unto every feathered fowl, and to every beast of the field, Assemble yourselves, and come; gather yourselves on every side to my sacrifice that I do sacrifice for you, even a great sacrifice upon the mountains of Israel, that ye may eat flesh, and drink blood.
- 18 Ye shall eat the flesh of the mighty, and drink the blood of the princes of the earth, of rams, of

- lambs, and of goats, of bullocks, all of them fatlings of Bashan.
- 19 And ye shall eat fat till ye be full, and drink blood till ye be drunken, of my sacrifice which I have sacrificed for you.
- 20 Thus ye shall be filled at my table with horses and chariots, with mighty men, and with all men of war, saith the Lord God.
- 21 And I will set my glory among the heathen, and all the heathen shall see my judgment that I have executed, and my hand that I have laid upon them.
- 22 So the house of Israel shall know that I *am* the LORD their God from that day and forward.
- 23 ¶ And the heathen shall know that the house of Israel went into captivity for their iniquity: because they trespassed against me, therefore hid I my face from them, and gave them into the hand of their enemies: so fell they all by the sword.
- 24 According to their uncleanness and according to their transgressions have I done unto them, and hid my face from them.
- 25 Therefore thus saith the Lord God; Now will I bring again the captivity of Jacob, and have mercy upon the whole house of Israel, and

will be jealous for my holy name;

- 26 After that they have borne their shame, and all their trespasses whereby they have trespassed against me, when they dwelt safely in their land, and none made *them* afraid.
- 27 When I have brought them again from the people, and gathered them out of their enemies' lands, and am sanctified in them in the sight of many nations;
- 28 Then shall they know that I am the LORD their God, which caused them to be led into captivity among the heathen: but I have gathered them unto their own land, and have left none of them any more there.
- 29 Neither will I hide my face any more from them: for I have poured out my spirit upon the house of Israel, saith the Lord God.

CHAPTER 40

In the five and twentieth year of our captivity, in the beginning of the year, in the tenth *day* of the month, in the fourteenth year after that the city was smitten, in the selfsame day the hand of the LORD was upon me, and brought me thither.

2 In the visions of God brought he me into the land of Israel, and set me upon a very high mountain, by which *was* as the frame of a city on the south.

- 3 And he brought me thither, and, behold, *there was* a man, whose appearance *was* like the appearance of brass, with a line of flax in his hand, and a measuring reed; and he stood in the gate.
- 4 And the man said unto me, Son of man, behold with thine eyes, and hear with thine ears, and set thine heart upon all that I shall shew thee; for to the intent that I might shew *them* unto thee *art* thou brought hither: declare all that thou seest to the house of Israel.
- 5. And behold a wall on the outside of the house round about, and in the man's hand a measuring reed of six cubits *long* by the cubit and an hand breadth: so he measured the breadth of the building, one reed; and the height, one reed.
- 6 ¶ Then came he unto the gate which looketh toward the east, and went up the stairs thereof, and measured the threshold of the gate, which was one reed broad; and the other threshold of the gate, which was one reed broad.
- 7 And *every* little chamber *was* one reed long, and one reed broad;

and between the little chambers were five cubits; and the threshold of the gate by the porch of the gate within was one reed.

- 8 He measured also the porch of the gate within, one reed.
- 9 Then measured he the porch of the gate, eight cubits; and the posts thereof, two cubits; and the porch of the gate *was* inward.
- 10 And the little chambers of the gate eastward *were* three on this side, and three on that side; they three *were* of one measure: and the posts had one measure on this side and on that side.
- 11 And he measured the breadth of the entry of the gate, ten cubits; *and* the length of the gate, thirteen cubits.
- 12 The space also before the little chambers *was* one cubit *on this side*, and the space *was* one cubit on that side: and the little chambers *were* six cubits on this side, and six cubits on that side.
- 13 He measured then the gate from the roof of *one* little chamber to the roof of another: the breadth *was* five and twenty cubits, door against door.
- 14 He made also posts of threescore cubits, even unto the post of the court round about the gate.

- 15 And from the face of the gate of the entrance unto the face of the porch of the inner gate *were* fifty cubits.
- 16 And *there were* narrow windows to the little chambers, and to their posts within the gate round about, and likewise to the arches: and windows *were* round about inward: and upon *each* post *were* palm trees.
- 17 Then brought he me into the outward court, and, lo, *there were* chambers, and a pavement made for the court round about: thirty chambers *were* upon the pavement.
- 18 And the pavement by the side of the gates over against the length of the gates *was* the lower pavement.
- 19 Then he measured the breadth from the forefront of the lower gate unto the forefront of the inner court without, an hundred cubits eastward and northward.
- 20 ¶ And the gate of the outward court that looked toward the north, he measured the length thereof, and the breadth thereof.
- 21 And the little chambers thereof *were* three on this side and three on that side; and the posts thereof and the arches thereof were after the measure of the first gate:

the length thereof *was* fifty cubits, and the breadth five and twenty cubits.

- 22 And their windows, and their arches, and their palm trees, were after the measure of the gate that looketh toward the east; and they went up unto it by seven steps; and the arches thereof were before them.
- 23 And the gate of the inner court *was* over against the gate toward the north, and toward the east; and he measured from gate to gate an hundred cubits.
- 24 ¶ After that he brought me toward the south, and behold a gate toward the south: and he measured the posts thereof and the arches thereof according to these measures.
- 25 And there were windows in it and in the arches thereof round about, like those windows: the length was fifty cubits, and the breadth five and twenty cubits.
- 26 And *there were* seven steps to go up to it, and the arches thereof *were* before them: and it had palm trees, one on this side, and another on that side, upon the posts thereof.
- 27. And *there was* a gate in the inner court toward the south: and he measured from gate to gate

- toward the south an hundred cubits.
- 28 And he brought me to the inner court by the south gate: and he measured the south gate according to these measures;
- 29 And the little chambers thereof, and the posts thereof, and the arches thereof, according to these measures: and *there were* windows in it and in the arches thereof round about: *it was* fifty cubits long, and five and twenty cubits broad.
- 30 And the arches round about *were* five and twenty cubits long, and five cubits broad.
- 31 And the arches thereof *were* toward the utter court; and palm trees *were* upon the posts thereof: and the going up to it *had* eight steps.
- 32 ¶ And he brought me into the inner court toward the east: and he measured the gate according to these measures.
- 33 And the little chambers thereof, and the posts thereof, and the arches thereof, were according to these measures: and there were windows therein and in the arches thereof round about: it was fifty cubits long, and five and twenty cubits broad.

- 34 And the arches thereof *were* toward the outward court; and palm trees *were* upon the posts thereof, on this side, and on that side: and the going up to it *had* eight steps.
- 35 ¶ And he brought me to the north gate, and measured *it* according to these measures;
- 36 The little chambers thereof, the posts thereof, and the arches thereof, and the windows to it round about: the length *was* fifty cubits, and the breadth five and twenty cubits.
- 37 And the posts thereof *were* toward the utter court; and palm trees *were* upon the posts thereof, on this side, and on that side: and the going up to it *had* eight steps.
- 38 And the chambers and the entries thereof *were* by the posts of the gates, where they washed the burnt offering.
- 39 ¶ And in the porch of the gate *were* two tables on this side, and two tables on that side, to slay thereon the burnt offering and the sin offering and the trespass offering.
- 40 And at the side without, as one goeth up to the entry of the north gate, *were* two tables; and on the other side, which *was* at the

- porch of the gate, were two tables.
- 41 Four tables *were* on this side, and four tables on that side, by the side of the gate; eight tables, whereupon they slew *their sacrifices*.
- 42 And the four tables were of hewn stone for the burnt offering, of a cubit and an half long, and a cubit and an half broad, and one cubit high: whereupon also they laid the instruments wherewith they slew the burnt offering and the sacrifice.
- 43 And within *were* hooks, an hand broad, fastened round about: and upon the tables *was* the flesh of the offering.
- 44 ¶ And without the inner gate were the chambers of the singers in the inner court, which was at the side of the north gate; and their prospect was toward the south: one at the side of the east gate having the prospect toward the north.
- 45 And he said unto me, This chamber, whose prospect *is* toward the south, *is* for the priests, the keepers of the charge of the house.
- 46 And the chamber whose prospect *is* toward the north *is* for the priests, the keepers of the charge of the altar: these *are* the sons of Zadok among the sons of

Levi, which come near to the LORD to minister unto him.

47 So he measured the court, an hundred cubits long, and an hundred cubits broad, foursquare; and the altar *that was* before the house.

48 ¶ And he brought me to the porch of the house, and measured *each* post of the porch, five cubits on this side, and five cubits on that

side: and the breadth of the gate *was* three cubits on this side, and three cubits on that side.

49 The length of the porch was twenty cubits, and the breadth eleven cubits; and he brought me by the steps whereby they went up to it: and there were pillars by the posts, one on this side, and another on that side.

DEVOTIONAL COMMENTS

Chapters 38 and 39 deal with a new and great victory. These chapters picture the famous battle of Gog and Magog. Do not confuse this war with the Battle of Armageddon, described in Revelation 19:11-21, because Armageddon takes place at the end of the seven year Tribulation Period that follows the Rapture of the Church. Nor is it the same as the battle involving Gog and Magog, mentioned in Revelation 20:7-9, for that will take place at the close of the 1,000 year reign of Christ, when Satan will again be loosed. The battle given in Ezekiel 38 and 39 takes place at the time when the Jews are safely living in their own land in the latter years (chapter 38:8). You might wonder when this will be. It seems probable that it will be during the first three and one-half years of the Tribulation Period, when Israel will be protected from Egypt and Russia by her covenant with the head of the Roman Empire.

Chapters 40—48 constitute Ezekiel's remarkable vision of the restored land of Israel, with the people occupying the land during the Kingdom Age. The date was April, 573 B.C., on the occasion of the 25th anniversary of the prophet's exile. Ezekiel was supernaturally transported in vision to Israel, and prophesied from a future idealistic standpoint "upon a very high mountain."

1785 PETER CARTWRIGHT'S BIRTHDAY.

Peter Cartwright was a famous Methodist circuitriding preacher. He was the old-fashioned, mourner's bench, camp-meeting kind of preacher. He was one of the great men in the revival of his day.

One time Peter Cartwright was preaching in Atlanta, Georgia, to a large audience when General Andrew Jackson walked in. Now Peter Cartwright was not the best English student in the world. He would split infinitives, hang his gerunds, and dangle his participles, but he was a faithful Gospel preacher and a man who preached with great power. When General Jackson walked in, a minister on the platform behind Mr. Cartwright became nervous and pulled Mr. Cartwright's coat tail saying, "Peter, General Jackson just walked in." Peter Cartwright shook his coat tail and kept on preaching a Hell that is hot, sin that is black, an eternity that is long, and salvation that is real. He got to preaching so hard that the reverend got concerned again. Again he pulled the coat tail of Peter Cartwright and said, "Peter, be careful. General Jackson just walked in." Peter Cartwright shook his coat tail and kept on preaching. Finally, the reverend pulled the coat tail again and said, "Peter,

please be careful, because General Jackson just walked in."

Peter Cartwright became impatient and shouted as loud as he could, "Reverend, you tell General Jackson, if he doesn't get born again, he will go to Hell just like anybody else!" Of course, the crowd roared.

After the service, General Jackson came to the front and asked Peter Cartwright to eat with him. At the restaurant General Jackson said, "Mr. Cartwright, if I had the power with my men that you have with God and man, I would never lose another battle as long as I live."

The Story of the Psalms

PSALMS 84, 85, AND 87

THE STORY BEHIND THE PSALMS:

These Psalms were written for the sons of Korah, who were Levites. The Levites formed one of the twelve tribes of Israel. Each of the twelve tribes was given a portion of the land of Canaan, except for the tribe of Levi. The other eleven tribes were to bring tithes of their increase to a storehouse. From the storehouse the Levites gathered their necessities.

Now there were three families in the tribe of Levi. The family of Gershon, which became the Gershonites, whose job it was to carry the tent itself; that is, the tabernacle. Then there was the family of Kohath, which carried the furniture. Then the family of Merari carried the boards and the bars.

Kohath had a son whose name was Korah. (By the way, Moses and Aaron both came from the family of Kohath.) The family of Korah formed the singers and they were known as the sons of Korah. It was their job to praise the Lord, and from them David organized a great choir. These Psalms are choir specials sung by the sons of Korah and written for their use.

THE WAY THEY WERE USED BY GOD'S PEOPLE:

These Psalms were especially dear to the Jews while in captivity in Babylon.
